Becoming the Church You've Always Wanted

Galatians 5:13-26

We have been chosen to fulfill God's purpose in our generation;

His purpose? To form a community of people in whom His Presence dwells,

His priorities practiced, His transformative power seen, and His reconciliation plan explained and expanded.

Because of this goal,

You were the object of grace that drew you into relationship with God.

Your insurmountable debt of sin has been cancelled.

Your security from harm has been guaranteed.

You were made alive by the will of God, the work of Christ and the wooing of the Holy Spirit. As a result, you are God's child, Christ's bride and the Holy Spirit's temple.

What the specific purposes and practices in which we are to be engaged?

- 1. *I was created for God's pleasure,* so I will WORSHIP God as I submit every area of my life to His will for me.
- 2. *I was adopted into God's family*, so I will FELLOWSHIP with honor and love those who share my spiritual experience.
- 3. *I was given spiritual understanding*, so I will study and apply the WORD of GOD so my life increasingly reflects God's character.
- 4. *I was gifted to SERVE God*, so I will invest in ministry to others so that a part of God's virtue can be experienced personally.
- 5. *I was a recipient of the grace of God,* so I will SHARE my experience of God's mercy and blessing.

A Danish proverb goes like this- What you are is God's gift to you; what you do with yourself is your gift to God.

John Wesley lived by this motto: I will do all the good that I can, by all means I can, in all the ways I can, in all the places I can, at all the times I can, to all the people I can, as long as I can.

How can we become the people He's called us to be? We can only become the church we've always wanted by His prompting, His energy and His leading.

It is called walking by the Spirit.

The Old Covenant was anchored in the Law and the commandments. There were thousands of them. People of faith in those days thought in terms of tablets of stone and avoiding judgment. Jesus' redemption brought about a new work in people's hearts. His rule over us is by an inner work of His Spirit as He communicates by way of our spirit to obedience and response. We listen for His voice. It's a lot simpler.

The New Covenant Broke our Bondage to the Law and Flesh

¹³For you were called to freedom, brethren; only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. ¹⁴For the whole Law is fulfilled in one word, in the

statement, "YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF." ¹⁵But if you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

Walking by the Spirit Cancels Your Flesh and its Fruit

¹⁶But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh. ¹⁷For the flesh sets its desire against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; for these are in opposition to one another, so that you may not do the things that you please. ¹⁸But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the Law. ¹⁹Now the deeds of the flesh are evident, which are: immorality, impurity, sensuality, ²⁰idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, disputes, dissensions, factions, ²¹envying, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these, of which I forewarn you, just as I have forewarned you, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

Walking by the Spirit Releases His Presence and Fruit

²²But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. ²⁴Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. ²⁵If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit. ²⁶Let us not become boastful, challenging one another, envying one another.

Anne Morrow Lindberg observed somewhere in her timeless little book, *Gift from the Sea*, that most of us don't really mind pouring our lives out for a reason. What we do resent is the feeling that it is being dribbled away in small, meaningless drops for no good reason. Living for God's divine purposes for which He created us is the noblest reason of all to pour out our lives. We are meant to give our all for Him in response to His for us. And while each of our offerings are uniquely our own, they all center in our corporate expression in our obligation to God and to each other- love God by offering our worship and learning of Him and his will for us and loving each other in service, fellowship and sharing Him with others. It's not that complicated and it is with His Spirit's enablement. Eternity will record whether we soar in the clouds or whether we waddle home.
